In their typical professional fashion, they have given the board several months notice so that replacements can be identified, hired and trained. They will remain working through this summer and into October.

With that, this summer will proceed normally with BJ and Caroline at the helm. All of the camps will go on as usual and their goal is to make the summer as memorable as ever.

Meanwhile, the Daybreak Board of Directors has formed a search committee to find the new Co-Executive Director Couple. The committee is moving full speed ahead and good progress has already been made.

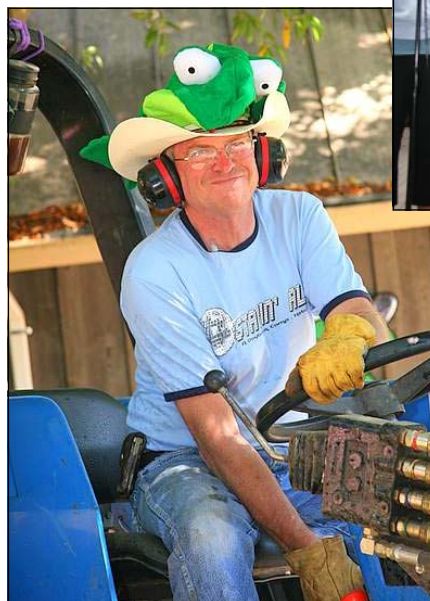

All of the Daybreak-sponsored camps (Adventure Camp, FDC, WildSide, and Labor Day Youth Rally) will continue as they have, as well as the other camps that have resided at Daybreak for years (e.g. Opportunity Camp). Lord willing, the new Co-Executive Director Couple will be hired this summer and training will commence. During the off-season, BJ and Caroline will move out and the new Co-Executive Director Couple will move in; also, the training and transition will both be completed. By next summer, the new Co-Executive Director Couple will be up to full-speed, and we will have a great summer of inspiring camps. The Board and the new Co-Executive Director Couple together will continue to drive improvements adding value to Daybreak on into the future.

In reflecting on their decision, I can hardly believe that BJ and Caroline have been at Daybreak for 15 years already. Mere words cannot express my thanks for their contributions to Daybreak over the years. We are in such a different place today, as a ministry, than we were when they started: in the way the camp operates, the way the board operates, the capabilities of the facility, even the size of the camp facility. After Brian drew up the plans and secured the supplies list, the materials were ordered and delivered in preparation for the project. Brian asked men and boys from the Campbell congregation where Brian and his family worship, to come to Daybreak for a couple of Saturdays in December to complete the project. 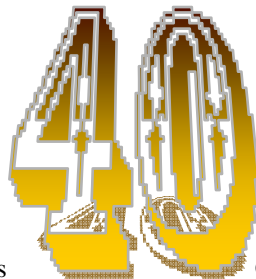
